

STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES AND EARLY DISMISSALS



Each Spring we host our student-led conferences where students lead the conference and demonstrate to parents the learning progression that they have made thus far in Literacy, Numeracy, Core Competencies and other learning areas. These conferences are meant to promote the notion that students are active participants in the learning process and that they "own" their learning first and foremost.

Classes maintain portfolios, collecting evidence of growth along the way. At AHE, each student has some sort of portfolio to share with their caregivers for the Spring and they also receive a "shorter" progress profile that summarizes key learning areas. Due to COVID restrictions, we are changing our format this year. Here is a quick overview of what to expect:

- In the week of March 8-12 please expect that the portfolio will come home to you.
- Each teacher will communicate specifics of their student-led to be completed at home (sometime that week) with the child leading the conference.
- On March 16th or 17th, parents will be able to pick a "10-minute time slot" so that any questions can be answered and goals for learning can be set. This choice of time will be on Teams and done through Microsoft bookings. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THE STUDENT-LED CONFERENCE IS COMPLETE PRIOR TO THIS TIME.
- Please watch for detailed instructions from your classroom teacher for how to book your goal setting time.

Do you have a child born in 2016? It's time to register for Kindergarten in Revelstoke!

We are excited to welcome parents and guardians to register all children turning five years old in 2021 for Kindergarten starting this September! Revelstoke School District wants to ensure that staff and resources are in place at our neighbourhood schools to meet the needs of all Kindergarten students in our community. Registering new Kindergarten students during **January 25th – 29st, 2021** helps us to be ready for our new young learners!

How to Register for Kindergarten

Parents and guardians of new students must register at your neighbourhood school. If a placement to another school is desired, please still register at the neighbourhood school and request to apply for a cross-boundary placement.

Registration forms will be available on January 25th by non-contact pickup at each elementary school, or can be emailed to you directly by contacting your neighbourhood school. Registration forms can also be downloaded from SD19's website.

Information required to complete Kindergarten registration:

Proof of age/citizenship : child's birth certificate and/or proof of Canadian citizenship or
immigration documents
Proof of BC residency: Medical Services Plan/BC Care Card

☐ Proof of local address: e.g. drivers licence or utility bill

Please submit your child's registration form and copies of required information at your neighbourhood school's non-contact drop box or via email during our registration week.

Opportunities will be provided in the spring for caregivers and children to meet and ask questions regarding the transition of your child to Kindergarten. If you have immediate questions, or would like further information, please feel free to call the School District office (250)837-2101, or your neighbourhood school.

We are looking forward to starting a lifelong journey of learning and growing with new Kindergarten students in September 2021!
